

 - Level of authorization
- Owned by business unit

- Geographic location
- Government Involvement
- Initial Internet Search
- Compensation
- Scope of Goods/Services
- Skills/Qualifications
- Experience with 3rd Party
- Client Recommendation

Step 3: What do you need to know?

Key Elements of Due Diligence:

- Data Collection
- Verification and Validation
- Evaluation of Warning Signs
- Scope of review depends on risk assessment (H-M-L)

- Qualifications
- Reference checks
- Licenses & registration
- Sanctioned parties
- Connections (PEP's)
- Identification / Selection
- Compensation
- Litigation & criminal investigations

Step 4: What did we learn?

Verification & Validation

- Seek clarifying information
- Verification and Validation
- Independent review

Evaluation

- Checklist of warning signs
- Outline decision, rationale and mitigating factors



Step 5: Yes or No? And then what?

Approval

- Level of approval depends on risk
- Documentation

Post-Approval

- Contract terms
- Annual certification
- Training
- Update due diligence

What we do

- Policy states that **pre-approval** is required for all meals, gifts and entertainment with foreign government officials
- Limited blanket pre-approval recently implemented
- Electronic forms submitted to request pre-approval or report those no longer needing pre-approval but which still require reporting
- Forms go into a Sharepoint Site which allows research and tracking
- All transactions are reported
